The owners mentioned that they got a new puppy a month ago but no other cats in the house. On PE, the mucous membranes are icteric. Hydration appears to be normal. The cat is lethargic. The chest sounds OK and abdominal palpation is normal. There is evidence of loss of muscle mass when palpating over the back. TPR normal. CBC gave PCV 26%. Chem Panel : ALP 784 (6-125) GGT 2 (1) ALT 130 (30-100) AST- normal. T. Bilirubin was also increased . Urinalysis revealed +4 bilirubin . Radiograph shows liver slightly enlarged. 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4.1.18. 5 yr old female shepherd mix presents from "being kicked by a cow" ...

Author: Brooke Delaney

5 yr old female shepherd mix presents from "being kicked by a cow" 3 days earlier. Dog is not vomiting or diarrhea but has dark urine. She is lethargic, reluctant to work and has poor appetite. You examine the dog and find her to be depressed, 5% dehydrated and a little painful on abdominal palpation. The color is pale and the membranes appear yellow. You take the dog out of the barn into the sunlight and sure enough the dog has icteric sclera and membranes. Abdominal radiographs show considerable free fluid in abdomen. Sample collected appears yellow-green in color. Cytology examination identifies bilirubin crystals and degenerate neutrophils. Further analysis of the fluid finds the bilirubin concentration to be 16.8 mg/dl. CBC results PCV 49% and T, Bilirubin of 8.4 mg/dl. What would be the best approach?

- The history of trauma , free abdominal bilirubin and icterus suggest a possible ruptured extrahepatic biliary system. Surgery is the best approach.
